

Job Description: PM SUPERVISOR (MOSQUITO CONTROL)

SUMMARY OF POSITION

Schedules night crew, maintains reports on evening surveillance data, assists in ULV ground treatments, and assists General Foreman (Mosquito Control) in maintaining ground equipment, shop, and grounds.

ORGANIZATIONAL RELATIONSHIPS

1. Reports to: Mosquito Control Director
2. Directs: Supervises Night Mosquito Control Operations and Pest Control.
3. Other: Has contact with ranchers, farmers, local community organizations, other county employees, and the general public.

EXAMPLES OF WORK

Essential Duties*

Conducts identification procedures to identify adult mosquitoes and mosquito larva;

Prepares adulticiding schedule for night crew;

Prepares required periodic reports on evening surveillance data, rainfall data, and pumphouse maintenance, and fills out the required forms;

Assist General Foreman (Mosquito Control) in maintaining equipment and grounds, including performing routine and preventive maintenance on trucks, motors, light traps, and pumps, preparing vehicles and spray equipment for treatment operations, and cleaning shop;

Assists in ULV ground treatments as necessary and takes phone calls for special requests;

Conducts various surveillance and observation procedures by land and water, including conducting landing rate counts in designated areas such as marshes, ditches, and rice fields; and

Collects rainfall data, including reading rain gauges, and prepares monthly reports.

Other Important Duties*

Performs such other related duties as may be assigned.

REQUIRED KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS, AND ABILITIES

Knowledge of: adulticiding and larviciding procedures and techniques; pest control procedures; surveillance and observation procedures; mosquito and larva collection sampling techniques; and mechanical repair techniques.

Skill/Ability to: safely handle and mix hazardous chemicals; give, follow, and understand instructions; establish and maintain effective working relationships other county employees, and the general public; operate various hand and power tools in the repair of engines, light traps, and motors; tolerate outside working conditions, including exposure to adverse weather conditions; and maintain appropriate necessary certifications, Texas driver's license applicable to job responsibilities, and good driving record.

ACCEPTABLE TRAINING AND EXPERIENCE

High school graduation, or its equivalent, plus at least one year of related experience;

or any equivalent combination of experience and training which provides the required knowledge, skills, and abilities.

CERTIFICATES AND LICENSES REQUIRED

Appropriate Texas driver's license; and noncommercial pesticide applicator's license from the Texas Department of Agriculture.
